#### A meeting with Bishop Michael Pryse

On November 23 Bishop Michael Pryse made the journey to Peterborough to talk to our Church Council. He was given a copy of a letter that was sent to the Commission by the Church Council which indicated our strong concern for maintaining a Lutheran presence in Peterborough.

Bishop Michael's first response was to say, "I am glad that the people of Christ feel so strongly about maintaining the Lutheran presence in Peterborough. It would be a shame if that was lost." Further to that, Bishop Michael shared that we are in the best position to deal with the final recommendation (which will be released in soon).

We cannot be told by the Anglican Archbishop Colin Johnson what we must do. The Anglican parishes will ultimately be directed by their Archbishop. The Anglican church structure supposes that each parish is an extension of their Diocese/Synod and all parishes must work under their purview while we in the Lutheran Church work independently from the Synod and may seek help and counsel from our Bishop when needed.

Bishop Michael's visit was helpful in many respects as he shared with us his experience working with Lutheran and Anglican parishes which have come together in places like Midland, Orillia, Guelph and Mississauga. He talked to us about how any new arrangement where two parishes come together should be for a trial period in the beginning. During that discussion explanations were shared about how assets like church buildings can be protected so that if such an arrangement does not work a congregation can return to its former self. This was all really good information to collect as one does not know what the future may hold.

The bottom line is that we at Christ Lutheran Church will determine our own future. The council has heard your concerns. We have heard you say during circle discussions that you do not want to lose your identity. We have heard you say that you do not want to move from your building. We have heard you say that you love to worship with Lutheran liturgy and from our hymn books. We have heard you say you do not want to lose current outreach opportunities. We have heard you say you want to remain Christ Evangelical Lutheran Church.

Throughout this whole process, Johanna and I have kept the Bishop informed about the commission's work and the conversations we have been having together as a congregation. The Bishop commented, "I think you already know what you (the people of Christ) are going to do."

The Bishop suggested that our next step be to wait for the final recommendation. Then council should look at it and make a recommendation to accept the recommendation of the Peterborough Anglican Lutheran Commission or to remove ourselves from the process. Then the next step would be to hold a congregational meeting to seek your support of the council recommendation.

As I close I want to share one more thing he said to me alone as he was leaving. "You have a good strong group of leaders in that room. You and the congregation should be proud of them."

It was a blessing to have Bishop Michael join us for the evening and to hear his many affirmations and support for the ministry we do in Peterborough. Blessings,
